

To Shipping a Car Across the Country

1. Research Auto Transport Companies Thoroughly
<ul> <li>□ Look for FMCSA and USDOT registration, valid insurance, &amp; transparent licensing.</li> <li>□ Ask for their Motor Carrier number and verify it on the FMCSA website to ensure they're properly licensed.</li> <li>□ Check independent reviews to explore positive customer feedback.</li> <li>□ Ask about specialized auto shipping services like enclosed carriers or winter route expertise, if necessary.</li> </ul>
2. Get Multiple Quotes to Compare Pricing & Services
<ul> <li>Use a quote comparison tool, or contact at least 3 transporters, to evaluate pricing trends for your route.</li> <li>Share accurate pickup &amp; delivery ZIP codes, vehicle year/make/model, and whether it's operable.</li> <li>Consider factors like open vs. enclosed, terminal vs. door-to-door, and peak-season surcharges.</li> <li>Be cautious of bait-and-switch tactics; insist on itemized quotes and confirm total price upfront.</li> </ul>
3. Prepare Your Vehicle for Transport
<ul> <li>□ Thoroughly clean your vehicle, both inside &amp; outside, before handing it over for long-haul auto transport.</li> <li>□ Take pictures of your vehicle's current condition to have a record in case of any damage during transport.</li> <li>□ Remove any personal belongings, loose items, or valuables from the car.</li> <li>□ Disable alarms and secure loose parts to avoid triggering alarms during transport.</li> <li>□ Ensure the fuel level is no more than a quarter tank.</li> <li>□ Check tire pressure, battery charge, and brake condition to facilitate safe loading.</li> </ul>
4. Complete All Necessary Paperwork
<ul> <li>□ Complete the Bill of Lading with accurate condition descriptions; use photos to cross-check upon delivery.</li> <li>□ Review terms closely: coverages, cancellation policies, potential deductibles, etc.</li> <li>□ Ask any &amp; all questions you may have before signing the agreement.</li> <li>□ Keep copies of vehicle registration and insurance handy, along with any special permits.</li> </ul>
5. Coordinate Pickup and Delivery
<ul> <li>Schedule pickup and delivery windows.</li> <li>Confirm exact addresses, arrangements for key handoff, and driver contact details.</li> <li>Use available real-time tracking tools to monitor shipment progress.</li> <li>Be flexible, as weather, traffic, and demand can shift schedules.</li> </ul>
6. Inspect Your Vehicle Upon Delivery
<ul> <li>Conduct a joint inspection using your pre-ship photos.</li> <li>Complete the delivery portion of the BOL carefully, noting any new damage.</li> <li>If damage is found, photograph it, document details, get insurance info, and file a claim within 24 hours.</li> </ul>
